Rootbert Fund Scholarships: \$2,000-\$3,000 one-time supplementary grant for following school year (approx. 20 awarded). Open to all regardless of sex, age, color, nationality or religious background. While the Fund does not emphasize any particular form of religious practice or worship, it seeks to provide support to persons motivated by spiritual values. The Fund has awarded grants to persons entering a wide range of careers. However, preference will be given to those who can satisfy high scholastic requirements and are considering careers in education. In making a decision to apply, applicants should also keep in mind that if they are awarded a grant, they will be obligated to attend at least one weekend fellowship conference sponsored by the Fund during the first year on grant. NOTICE: North Fork Scholarships that have had several Tech winners in past years have been discontinued. North Fork Bank was bought out by Capital One.

Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarships: \$1,500/yr., renewable for four years. Students must have a minimum Byrd GPA of 98.0 and a minimum combined score of 1875 on the SAT1 (combined critical reading + math + writing) at one sitting. An explanation can be read in detail at www.highered.nysed.gov/kiap/scholarships/home.htm Applications and worksheets for completing the Byrd GPA from the College Office, 1W2. *Students should be aware that past winners in New York State had Byrd GPA's higher than 99.* Applications and worksheets must be returned to 7E2 before **Feb. 10, 2009** to insure that paperwork is complete and correct before the school signs off to meet the March 1 deadline.

University of Cincinnati College of Engineering: Competitive, merit-based scholarships available. Also, merit-based scholarships available for women, African American, Hispanic, and Native American students. Minimum of \$9,100. Admission and scholarship requirements: SAT1 1170 (CR+Math) or top 5% and 3.0 GPA (83). Deadline for application to UC, **Jan. 15, 2009**. Info online at www.eng.uc.edu/nesp

KFC Scholars Program: Up to \$5,000. High school GPA of 2.75 (80). Applications on line from Dec. 1 through Feb. 10, 2009 at www.kfcscholars.org

Stevens Institute of Technology, Kaminski Family Fund Scholarship: BTHS students are eligible and given preference for scholarship(s) established by Mr. Joseph Kaminski, Class of '56. If you apply to Stevens, your application is flagged as a Tech student, and you will automatically be considered and move to the head of the list.

Columbus Citizens Foundation College Scholarship Program: Awards grants and scholarships to students of Italian-American ancestry, with financial need (not to exceed \$25,000 income per household dependent, 80 GPA, and service to school and community. Deadline for applications: **Feb. 2, 2009**. Download application at www.columbuscitizensfd.org

Young Epidemiology Scholars Competition: Research competition. Requires research and 30 page paper. Awards include two \$50,000 scholarships. Deadline: **Feb. 2, 2009**. www.collegeboard.com/yes/index.html

Harlem YMCA: \$1,000-\$2,500, for African-American seniors. Renewable. Applications available in 7E2. Deadline: **Jan. 31** (must have materials to 7E2 by **Jan. 25**).

St. John's Catholic Student Scholarship: \$1,000-\$2500 (depending on financial need). Must be Catholic, minimum GPA of 83, and combined CR and M SAT of 1050. Application from 7E2. Deadline for scholarship application and application for admission: Feb. 1, 2009. **Ozanam Scholars Program:** Must show a dedication to serving the disadvantaged. GPA 85 and combined CR+M SAT of 1050. Requires recommendation from someone familiar with the applicant's commitment to service. Deadline **Feb. 1**. Application form in 7E2.

Comite Noviembre: \$1,000 scholarships. Eligibility: Puerto Rican, one year of volunteer community service, 80 GPA, be interviewed by the Selection Committee.
